Screen printing.




The US Forest Service is working on a delayed timeline of original proposed projects both at High Bank and locations downriver.

MRS decided we could not adhere to all of the historic guidelines and funding necessary for preservation of the old Turner Bend Bridge and it will be demolished in 2022/23.
